



Supporting Positive Behaviour at Wheatley Hill

As a caring, inclusive school at the heart of the local community, we want every child to achieve to the best of their ability. Therefore, we will have high expectations of pupil behaviour in school and we ask parents & carers to support us in promoting positive behaviour in school.

High Expectations

We will have high expectations of all of our pupils in school. To support pupils, we offer:-
+Additional Classroom Support +Quiet Workspaces +Quiet Lunch Room +Sensory Spaces
+Movement Breaks +Additional Teaching Resources +Zones of Regulation

Ready to Learn - Yellow Card C1

If a child is behaving inappropriately they will be given a Yellow Card C1:-
+ Pupils will miss **5 minutes** of next break / lunch to catch up with missed learning time.
+ Pupil may be offered additional adult support.
+ Pupil may be offered a quiet space in the classroom to re-focus for 5 mins.
+ A Sensory or Movement Break may be used to support pupils to re-focus.

Ready to Learn - Yellow Card C2

If a child is continuing to behave inappropriately they will be given a Yellow Card C2:-
+ Pupils will miss **10 minutes** of next break / lunch to catch up with missed learning time.
+ Pupil may be offered additional adult support.
+ Pupil may be offered a quiet space in the classroom to re-focus for 5 mins.
+ A Sensory or Movement Break may be used to support pupils to re-focus.

Ready to Learn - Red Card C3

If a child is continuing to behave inappropriately or has displayed dangerous behaviour choices, they will be given a Red Card C3:-
+ Pupils will be withdrawn from class to work in the Department Leaders Office.
+ Parents will be contacted and a C3 letter sent home.
+ Pupils will be offered support to manage their feelings & emotions.

Ready to Learn – More Help

If a child receives multiple C3s then further action will be taken:-
+ Behaviour Referral Meetings + Parental Contracts
+ Withdrawn from School Bus + Referral to Local Authority
